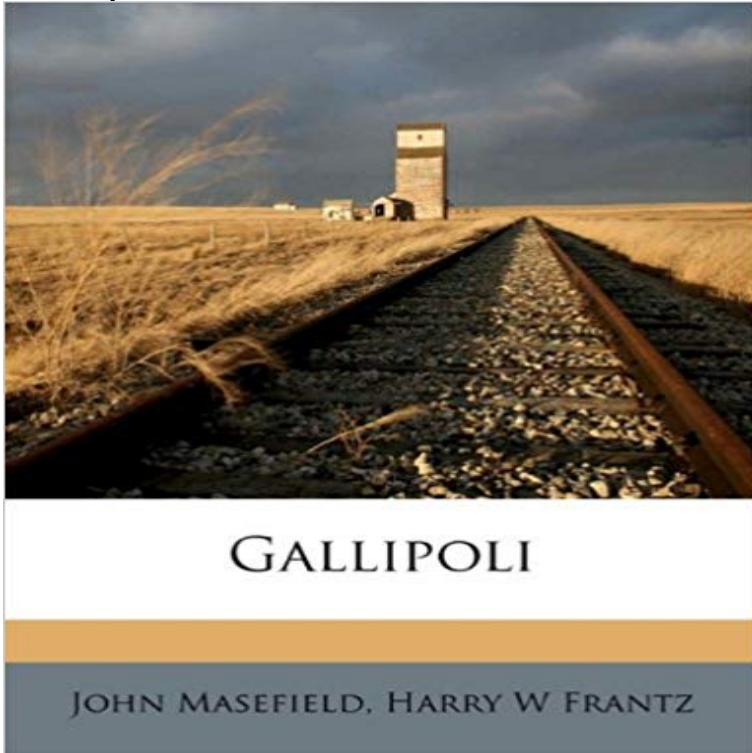


Gallipoli
