
A Paraphrase and notes on the Epistles of St. Paul to the Ephesians & Elements of natural philosophy





Lockes theory of mind is often cited as the origin of modern conceptions of identity and the self, figuring prominently in the work of later philosophers such as Hume, Rousseau and Kant. Locke was the first to define the self through a continuity of consciousness. He postulated that the mind was a blank slate or tabula rasa. Contrary to pre-existing Cartesian philosophy, he maintained that we are born without innate ideas, and that knowledge is instead determined only by experience derived from sense perception Elements of natural philosophyAt Oates, Locke supervised the education of young Francis Masham. Among his papers, he left the draft of an elementary textbook in natural science, written sometime after 1698. James Axtell4 discusses the work and suggests that Locke used material contributed by his friend Isaac Newton.
