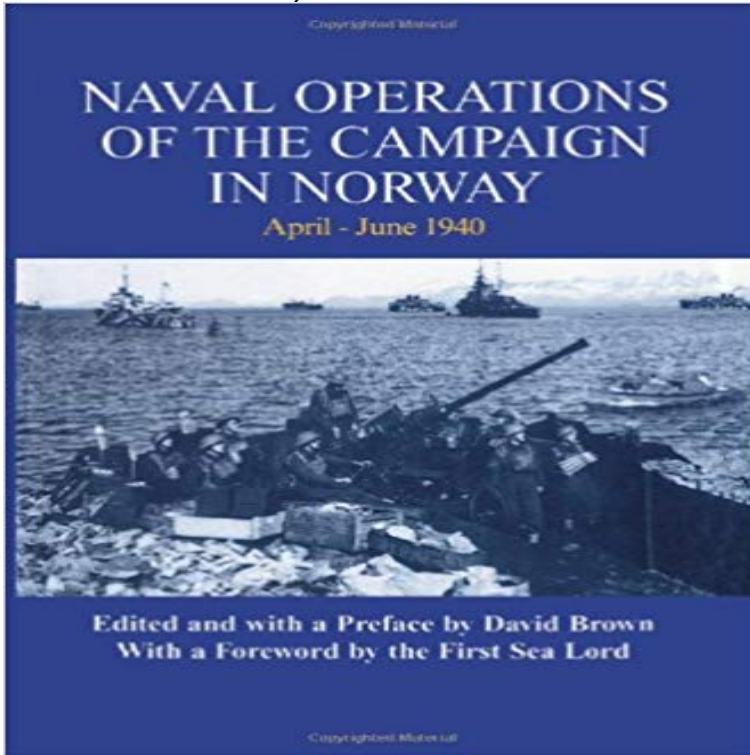


## Naval Operations of the Campaign in Norway, April-June 1940 (Naval Staff Histories)
