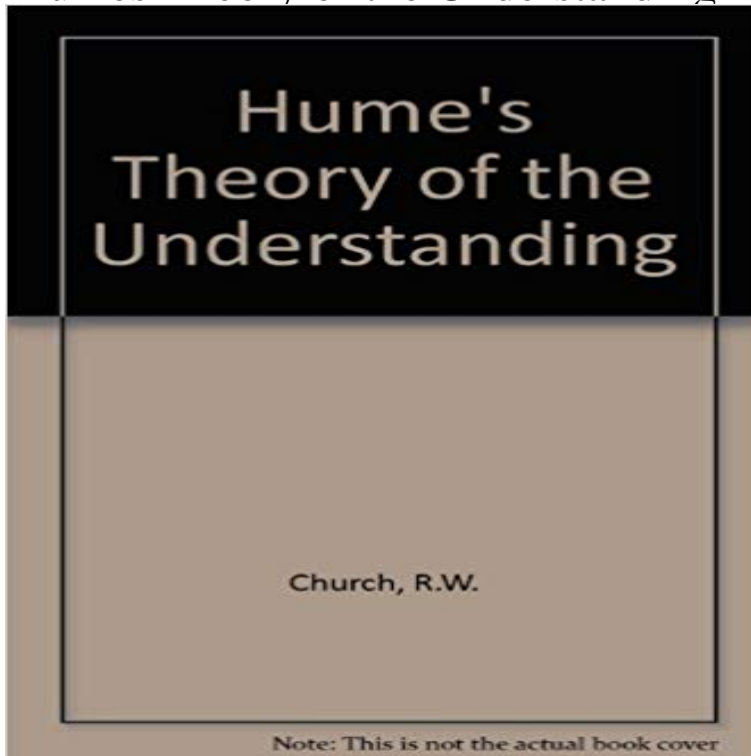


## Humes Theory of the Understanding
