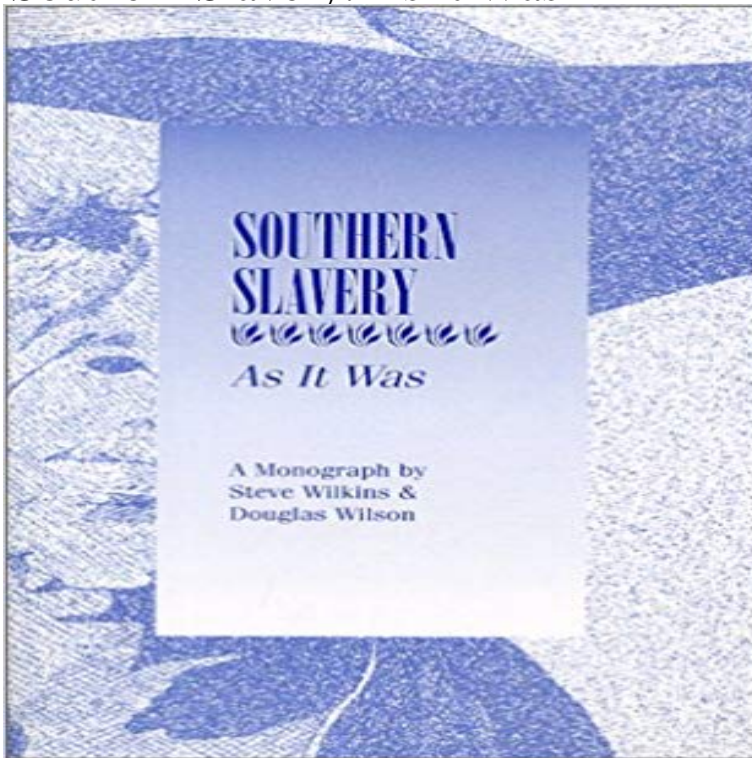


Southern Slavery: As It Was
