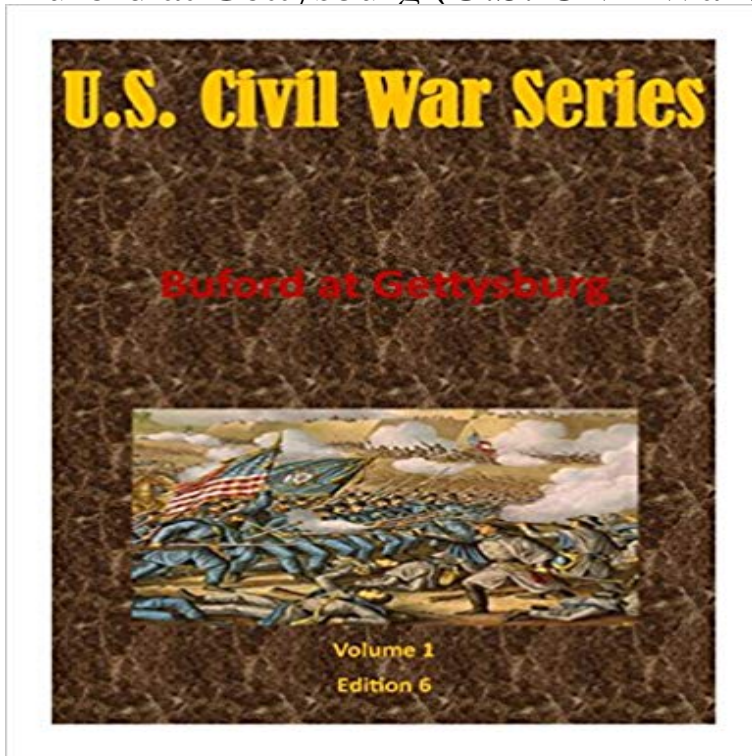


Buford at Gettysburg (U.S. Civil War Series)
